



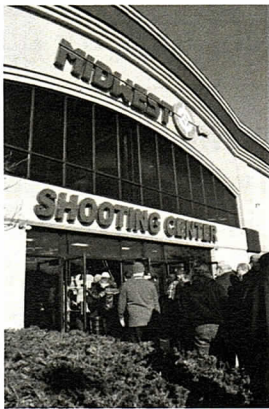

Cridersville residents will be voting on a contested mayoral race at the polls. Incumbent Rick Walls is being challenged by Councilman Frank Oen. Also on the ballot are three non-contested council seats. Current councilors Joe Bailey and Stacey Cook will appear on the ballot. Councilor Rick Allen will be a write-in candidate. All races are non-partisan.

The village will have a renewal of a 2-mill property tax for 4-years for current operating expenses. It is no new taxes and generates \$43,387 annually.

Polls open at 6:30 am and close at 7:30 pm. All registered voters within the village vote at Otterbein Cridersville.
