Recycle Do's & Don'ts



The Cridersville Recycle Center is managed by the Lions Club as a service project. We do receive money from the Auglaize County Solid Waste District that the club puts back into the community. The Lions want to remind those

using the self-serve chutes to please use the correct chutes. There has been an increase of improperly sorted items. This makes our job more difficult and can cause a decrease in the amount of money the club receives. So please read the signs and recycle responsibly. Items accepted through the chutes are #1 plastic, #2 solid colored plastic, #2 milky plastic, tin/steel food cans, aluminum cans, aluminum foil and pie pans. Mixed paper and corrugated cardboard go in marked dumpsters at the back of the building. The first Saturday of each month (except July & September) is full service from 9 am to 11 am with volunteers to unload your vehicle.
