Cridersville's Connection to NASA

Dr. Glenn SmithCridersville High School – Class of 1952

Glenn Smith was born on July 15, 1934. He is the son of Warren and Marsele Smith. The Smiths moved to Cridersville when Glenn was two years old. His maternal grandparents were Frank and Lelia Phillips of Cridersville. Smith attended all twelve years at Cridersville School on East Main Street. He graduated in 1952 in a class of fifteen students. He was elected Senior Class President. After graduating from Cridersville High School in 1952, Glenn Smith attended Bowling Green State University in



1952 and 1953. He then transferred to Ohio Northern University at Ada, Ohio. He graduated in 1956 with "High Distinction" and first in his class in the College of Engineering. While at Ohio Northern, Smith was an outstanding athlete in both basketball and baseball. He was inducted into the ONU Athletic Hall of Fame. In 1963 he earned a Master of Science degree in mechanical engineering at the University of Pittsburgh. He completed his Ph.D. in 1965; becoming Dr. Glenn Smith. His doctoral thesis topic was the heat transfer in nuclear reactors.

From 1956 until 1967 Smith also worked at Westinghouse Electric as a design engineer designing electric power generators for aircraft and the space program. In addition, he worked part time at the Atomic Power Labs in Pittsburgh. In 1967 he joined the staff at the NASA Johnson Space Center in Houston. As a project engineer and manager at NASA in Houston, Dr. Smith worked on the Apollo, Skylab, Space Shuttle and Space Station projects. He was the project lead for the team of astronauts, scientists, and engineers designing controls for the Apollo Telescope mount in Skylab. He also led the development of the Earth Resources Instruments for the Skylab program. Smith was also manager of the NASA Applications Program for the study of practical application of satellite data and deputy manager of Systems Engineering for the Space Shuttle program. He was co-designer of the proposed NASA Flyback Booster to improve Shuttle safety and reduce cost. In addition to his work at NASA, Smith was a lecturer on systems engineering at the European Space Agency. During his twenty seven years at the NASA Johnson Space Center, Dr. Glenn Smith was the winner of 25 Outstanding or Superior Performance Awards. He also gave testimony to Congressional Committees regarding safety and cost of space launch systems. Smith retired from NASA in 1994. Glenn Smith and his wife, Sue Montgomery from Bluffton, Ohio, continue to live in Houston, Texas. They have been married for more than 50 years and have four children and eleven grandchildren. Smith is active in his church, holds a commercial pilot's license, is an avid golfer, and a member of the Mensa Society of America and the NASA Alumni Association. Dr. Smith has many fond memories of growing up in Cridersville including free Saturday night movies on Main Street, the whole town going to basketball games at the Community Hall gymnasium, the medicine shows at the Town Hall, the B&O Depot, rationing during World War II, unreliable cars, and good music, good friends and good times.

Dr. Glenn Smith will be making a visit to Cridersville as part of the 50th Celebration of the Apollo 11 Mission and Neil Armstrong's "First Steps on the Moon". Smith will be in the Cridersville Firemen's Jamboree Grand Parade Saturday July 13th and at the Historical Museum following the parade. Smith will also participate in the 50th Anniversary parade in Wapakoneta on Sunday July 14th. And be sure to join the Cridersville Historical Society and Dr. Smith Monday July 15th to hear about his part in Apollo, Skylab, Space Shuttle and Space Station projects. His talk will begin at 7:00 p.m. in the Community Room at Otterbein Cridersville. Admission is free and refreshments will be provided.
